

MATHS CRITERIA

Helps children build a strong foundation in the key concepts for their age group.



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READY-TO-PROGRESS

Counting confidently

Year 1 pupils should be able to count forwards and backwards within 100 – from **any number**.

Support flexible counting every day. Try count on games at tidy up time.



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READY-TO-PROGRESS

Can they see the number in more than one way?

Ready-to-progress criteria expect Year 1 children to represent numbers up to 100 in multiple ways – numerals, words, pictures and physical objects.

Reinforce understanding by switching representations regularly!



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READY-TO-PROGRESS

Fluency that powers everything else

Fluent number bonds to 10 and
developing fluency to 20 are
essential for success in addition
and subtraction

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READY-TO-PROGRESS

What does the 4 in 47 mean?

By the end of year 1, pupils should understand two-digit numbers as tens and ones – foundational for KS1 maths.

Build fluency through daily quick-fire games!



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READY-TO-PROGRESS

+ - It's more than facts - It's understanding!

Children need to understand addition and subtraction using practical resources and not just recall.

Link stories, visuals, and action to deepen connections.



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READY-TO-PROGRESS

Seeing shapes in the real world

Year 1 learners should name and describe everyday 2D and 3D shapes – not just in books, but in the classroom and outdoors

Make shape hunts part of your daily routine
